self-centered Engrossed in oneself and one's own affairs; selfish.

self-gratification The act of giving oneself pleasure or of satisfying one's own desires.

self-deception The act of deceiving oneself or the state of being deceived by oneself

self-importance Excessively high regard for one's own importance or station; conceit.

selfish Concerned chiefly or only with oneself.

self-pity Pity for oneself, especially exaggerated or self-indulgent pity.

self-reliance Reliance or one's own capabilities, judgment, or resources; independence

self-righteous Piously sure of one's own righteousness; moralistic.

self-seeking Pursuing or exhibiting concern only one's own ends or interests.

egocentric Confined in attitude, interest or caring only about one's own needs or affairs.

inconsiderate Thoughtless of others; displaying a lack of consideration.

The Solution

selfless Having, exhibiting, or motivated by no concern for oneself; unselfish.

self-sacrifice Sacrifice of one's personal interests for the sake of others or for a cause.

unselfish Generous or altruistic.

altruism Unselfish concern for the welfare of others; selflessness.

self-knowledge Understanding or insight into one's own nature, abilities, and limitations

trust Firm reliance on the integrity, ability, of God.

God A force, effect, or being conceived as the perfect, omnipotent, omniscient creator.
